"Whether he is a sinner I do not know. One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see." - John 9:25

This morning Pastor Steve Williams reminded us that sharing our faith isn't as hard as we make it out to be. We don't have to have understanding, we have to have a story of transformation. That our story is one of transformation and restoration. The man in the passage today was SO transformed that he was totally unrecognizable.

• When people look at you, do you seem transformed? Restored?

Pastor Steve Williams challenges us with a bold prayer: "Jesus, transform me into the person You intended me to be. Restore me to be the person You made me to be. Clean away the sin that has gotten in the way." This is a prayer for EVERY person. We don't base our faith on our experience, but we share our experience as a way to lead people to the Truth, to Jesus.

 - What might happen if this prayer came alive in your life?
 - What is the most challenging thing about this prayer for you?
